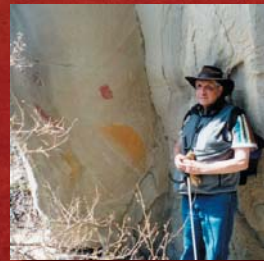

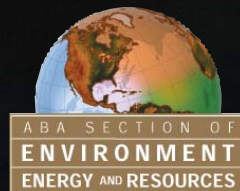
PROTECTING NATIVE AMERICAN HISTORIC PLACES ON PUBLIC LANDS

LEGAL ASPECTS OF HISTORIC PRESERVATION ON PUBLIC LANDS

This legal workshop will provide the basic legal tools needed to effectively protect historic and cultural properties important to Native Americans. The workshop will also include a session on tribal consultation, what is required of federal public lands agencies, and how practitioners can best ensure the adequacy of consultation. In addition, there will be a roundtable discussion on the effects of energy development on Native American historic resources.

Legal remedies found in historic preservation and environmental laws provide the basis for protecting these properties. This seminar will provide participants with the opportunity to garner a more thorough understanding of the unique issues involved in protecting Native American historic resources.

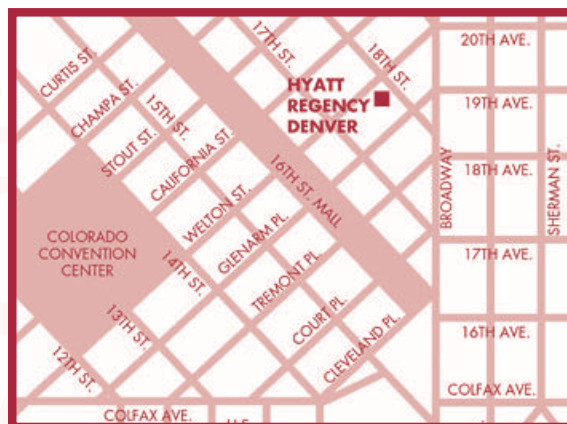
