

NATIONAL TRUST FOR HISTORIC PRESERVATION GRANT PROGRAMS

<u>Program</u>	<u>Description</u>
Telling the Full History Preservation Fund	One-time grant opportunity to help interpret and preserve historic places of importance to underrepresented communities across the country. This opportunity is made possible through the National Endowment for the Humanities' (NEH) American Rescue Plan Humanities Grantmaking for Organizations. Grants will be awarded for \$25,000 or \$50,000 to 60-80 humanities-based organizations. Deadline: December 15, 2021.
National Trust Preservation Funds	Grants to encourage preservation at the local level by supporting on-going preservation work and by providing seed money for preservation projects. Grants generally start at \$2,500 and range up to \$5,000. Deadlines: February 1, June 1, October 1 (annually).
Emergency/Intervention Funds	Intervention funding is awarded in emergency situations when immediate and unanticipated work is needed to save a historic structure, such as when a fire or other natural disaster strikes. Funding is restricted to nonprofit organizations and public agencies. Emergency grants typically range from \$1,000 to \$5,000. Deadline: Rolling.
Southwest Intervention Fund	Grants to further preservation efforts of the traditional cultures of the Southwest region, exclusively in Arizona, Colorado, New Mexico, West Texas* and Utah. Grants generally range from \$2,500 to \$10,000. Deadlines: February 1, June 1, October 1 (annually).
National Fund for Sacred Places	The National Fund for Sacred Places provides training, planning grants, and capital grants from \$50,000 to \$250,000 for congregations of all faiths. Visit www.FundforSacredPlaces.org for more details. Deadline: March 7, 2022.
